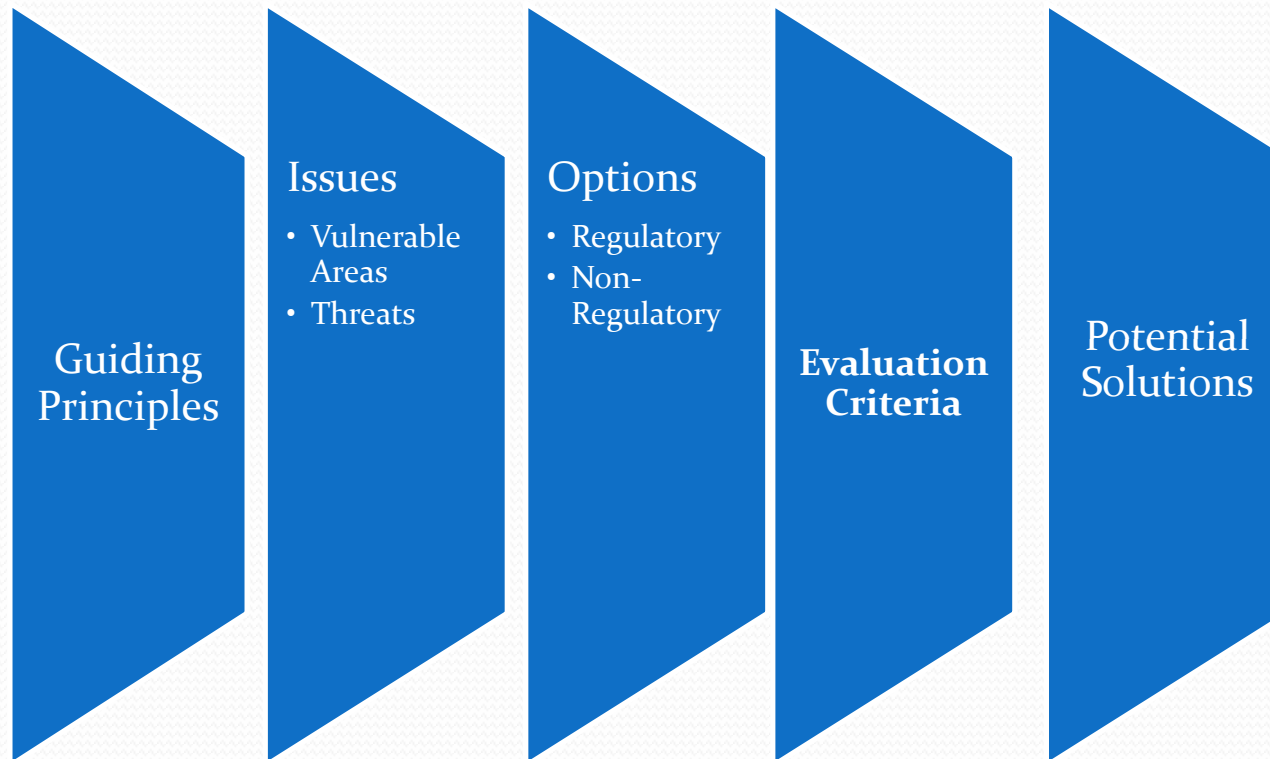

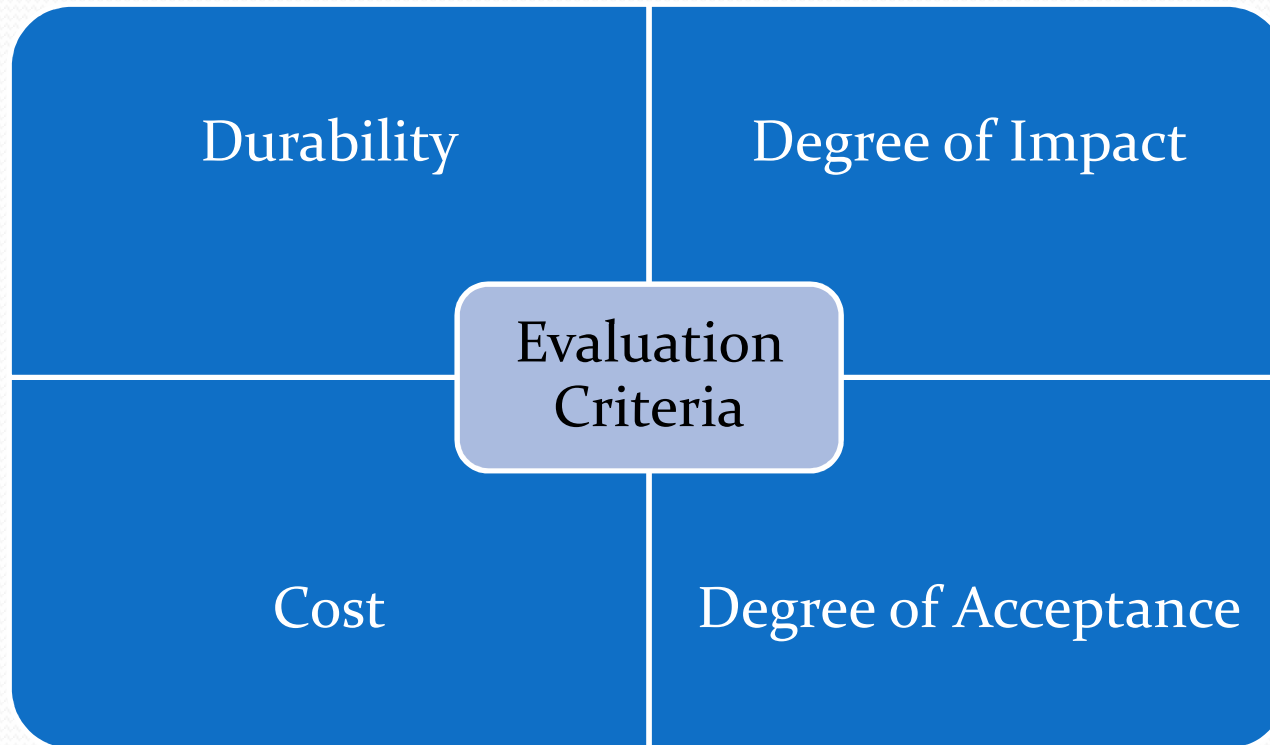

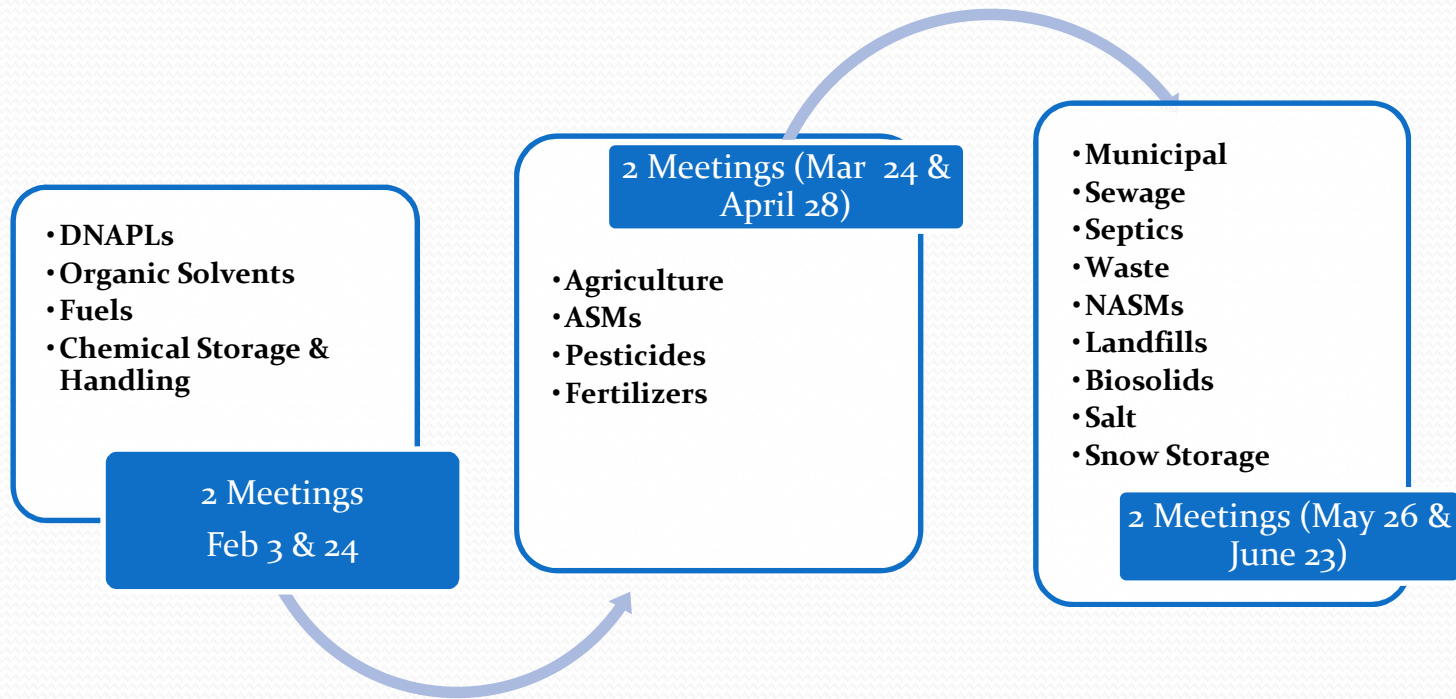

# Our Methodology

- Group similar threats together
- Spend 2 meetings dealing with each threat
  - First meeting – Information Gathering; Guest Speakers; Increasing our knowledge about how the threat is currently managed and identifying any issues associated with their management
  - Second meeting – Policy Development
- **By June: our objective is to have a full suite of policy options developed for all of the threat categories**

  1. Prescribed Threat Category
  2. Background Information (Definition; What causes this to be a drinking water threat; Applicable legislation, policies & programs)
  3. Local Information
  4. Applicable existing tools (legislation, regulations, etc.)
  5. Gaps in Existing Legislation, Policies & Programs
  6. Policy Options
  7. Assessment/Evaluation

# Our Approach

- Task Team Focus + Global Café
  - Task Teams to be led by Team Leads
- Reassess whether the policy development process is working and if any changes are needed
- Also need to identify any 'Parking Lot' issues – matters for follow up; items to remember for additional threats, etc.
